

Result 3: Farm4SD Trainthe-Trainers Programme for VET Educators

As always, we want to give an update on the progress and the accomplishments during the last months. The most important one is the progress of Result 3, which is the **Farm4SD Train-the-Trainers Programme for VET Educators**. This course has the aim to ensure that the content materials (R2) are



adequately and professionally delivered to our farmers. The focus is put on non-traditional, participatory, community-based coworking and selfdirected learning resources and on exploiting digital learning environments, based on the newest research and trends in effective learning.

Further, the training course for the VET-trainers gives input on qualifications' recognition and validation approaches - the updated ECVET and/or ECTS and micro-credentials - appropriate for a successful intervention focused on the needs of farmers.

The training course has been translated into all partner languages and is currently in the phase of pilot testing, through its delivery to at least 10 VET educator in each partner country. With the finalization, we will reach the final step for the delivery of the courses. After the successful completion of the Programme, the selected trainers will be fully equipped to deliver the training materials developed for the farmers (R2), which will commence in the up-coming year.



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The Jointed Staff Training Activity (LTTA) of the project partners in Slovenia proved to be extremely instructive and enriching. From September 19 to 21, 2023, we had the opportunity to deepen our cooperation, expand our professional skills and strengthen team spirit. Nine of our colleagues onsite, and more connected in a hybrid-way, came together to reskill and upskill on sustainability in the agricultural sector, on key competences regarding agriculture entrepreneurship, funding opportunities, advanced VET learning methods and techniques and the implementation of the updated ECVET, ECTS and Micro-credential approach in validating learning outcomes.

We were able to test the modules in a real training environment and received valuable feedback from our colleagues. This was very useful as it allowed us to refine our materials and teaching methods and adapt them to the needs of the learners. This training helped us to develop a deeper understanding of how to deliver knowledge and skills in a way that promotes sustainable learning.

Away from work, our host offered us a varied accompanying program that let us explore the culture and beauty of Slovenia. We had the opportunity to visit historical sites, taste local specialties and enjoy the breathtaking nature of the region. These activities not only helped to strengthen the cohesion in our team, but also gave us insights into the cultural nuances of the host country.

Special mention should be made of the excellent support we received from our Slovenian partner. The planning and execution of the LTTA was done with great care and dedication. The hosts were always on hand to ensure that our needs were met and were available to offer advice and assistance.

Overall, the project partners' training in Slovenia was an all-around successful event.
